

Supply List

Program: Pencil Drawing – Rural Alberta

Instructor: Susan Casault

Join us for a six-week session of drawing in graphite pencil with a rural Alberta theme. A collection of small drawings including farm implements and landscapes will be covered in class. Gain more confidence using proportion, values, perspective and textures to create realistic drawings. The class will be taught with demonstrations and one-on-one guidance. Some drawing experience is recommended.

Supplies Needed:

- Pencils: Artist's graphite 2H, HB, 2B and 4B pencils (eg: Staedtler, Faber Castell, or Derwent) and others if you have them
- Standard pencil sharpener (manual or battery operated)
- Erasing tools: gray kneaded eraser and/or white gum eraser
- Paper: one large sketchbook, approx. 9" x 12" or 11" x 14" is recommended OR any inexpensive drawing paper, cut to approx. 9" x 12" in size. (you will need 8 to 12 pieces)
- 12 to 16 inch ruler (clear works best)
- Brush - called a drafting or eraser brush – optional
- Blending tools: One paper stomp or tortillon, can be any size – optional
- Stylus (drafting) – optional
- \$3 fee for photo reference will be payable to the instructor

We will be drawing on tables. If you prefer to draw on a more upright surface, you may bring a drawing board.

If purchasing supplies at an art store, take your class receipt. They may give you a student discount. Some art stores in Edmonton include Colours Art and Framing, Delta Art and Drafting, The Gilded Rabbit, and The Paint Spot.
